



From our General Manager: October is Cooperative Month

As a participating member of the Wisconsin Federation of Cooperatives, we would like to share some fun facts and benefits about cooperative membership.

COOPERATIVES ARE MEMBER-OWNED BUSINESSES. Cooperatives, part of the self-help tradition of America, are businesses organized by people to provide needed goods and services. Our Telephone Cooperative businesses:

- Are owned by the people who use their services;
- Provide an economic benefit for their members;
- Are democratic organizations, controlled by their members;
- Are autonomous and independent;
- Recognize the importance of education about cooperative business and organizational practices;
- Support cooperation among cooperatives, resulting in the growing importance of cooperatives in today's global economy; and
- Exhibit concern for their communities.

COOPERATIVES SERVE MANY NEEDS.

They provide just about any good or service, even marketing products and goods for their members. Here are a few fun facts about cooperatives.

- Throughout the United States, approximately 48,000 cooperatives serve 120

million citizens. Worldwide, there are an estimated 750,000 cooperatives that serve 730 million members.

- 270 telephone cooperatives provide service to 2 million households.
- Two in every five people in the U.S. belong to a cooperative.
- Cooperatives come in all sizes, from small buying clubs to businesses included in the Fortune 500. Many cooperatives are household names—Land O'Lakes, Ocean Spray, Sunkist, ACE Hardware, Nationwide Insurance, and the Associated Press.
- About 30 percent of farmers' products and farm supplies in the United States are marketed through more than 3,000 farmer-owned cooperatives.

COOPERATIVES HAVE A BIG IMPACT ON WISCONSIN'S ECONOMY.

According to the most recent study by the University of Wisconsin Center for Cooperatives, 2.7 million cooperative members in the Badger State depend on approximately 800 co-ops to market and supply agricultural products as well as to provide credit, electricity, telephone service, health care, housing, insurance, and many other products and services. Wisconsin co-ops annually record about \$5.6 billion in gross sales and they employ approximately 23,400 Wisconsin residents.

WB and UPN becoming the CW Network on Channel 10

The CW Network will replace WB and appear on channel 10 of our cable systems. Earlier this year Warner Brothers and CBS announced that both WB and UPN networks would combine their resources to create a CW Network (C for CBS and W for Warner Brothers.) The launch of this new network will take place September 18th. CW will feature popular shows such as Gilmore Girls, Smallville, America's Next Top Model and Everybody Hates Chris.

Three Angels Broadcasting Network (3ABN) is coming to the RGTC and LTC cable systems.

This network appearing on channel 144 (145 in Spanish) is the "Mending Broken People Network," a 24-hour Christian television and radio network. 3ABN's

focus is to present programming which will reach people when they are hurting. 3ABN offers divorce recovery programs, drug and alcohol rehabilitation, cooking and health programs, stop smoking and weight loss, programs that deal with children and family issues, organic gardening, natural

Update on 3-digit Dialing

Help is just three digits away, but several of those easy numbers have changed and will be changing again. Previously, numbers like 811, 611, and 511 were used exclusively by telephone companies as toll free numbers for their customers to call the business office and report troubles. Slowly, the Federal Communications Commission is taking back these numbers for other purposes.

Please note, that beginning October 1, 2006, 811 will be re-routed to ring Digger's Hotline instead of our offices. Digger's Hotline is the FREE locator service that everyone needs to call before doing any digging or excavation to make sure there are no telephone, gas, or electric cables buried on the site where they are working.

Other three-digit dialing numbers include:

- 211, used for Great Rivers 211, the 24hour/7day Information Referral and Crisis Hotline.
- 411, the Anywhere in America Directory Assistance.
- 611, the toll free number for calling your telephone office from any of our exchanges.
- 711, the access number for the Telecommunication Relay System used by the people who are deaf, hard of hearing, deaf-blind, or speech disabled.
- 911, the fire, police, and rescue emergency number.

So please remember, when calling our offices, use 611. When you need to reach Digger's Hotline, call 811.

Update on Construction Projects

LaValle Telephone Building Update:

The LaValle building remodeling is underway. In the first phase of this project the front half of the building and business offices are being rebuilt. For the next couple of months customers are entering through a temporary door. In phase two we will reconstruct the back half of the building including some of our employee offices and conference rooms. During construction you can make your after-hours payments at State Bank of Cazenovia-LaValle station. We are hoping that the completed project will be ready by the end of December.

Richland-Grant Telephone Outdoor Projects:

At RGTC, we recently awarded a new cable plant project to Central Cable

Contractors in Waupun. This project consists of 16 miles of fiber and copper construction in the Blue River exchange area. The work is part of the cable rerouting needed in preparation for the

new State Highway 60 construction and County Trunk T projects. We anticipate that this project will be completed by the end of the 4th quarter.
