Scholarships for High School Seniors

Each year, LaValle Telephone Cooperative sponsors scholarships of up to \$500 for graduating high school seniors who have a parent or guardian with active service(s) in one of our local telephone exchanges.

In addition, the Cooperative co-sponsors scholarships through the Wisconsin State Telecommunications Foundation (WSTF) and the Foundation for Rural Service (FRS). These awards range from \$1,500 for the WSTF to \$2,500 for the FRS.
